A long series of public and private positions, including The Norwegian Government Commission for Freedom of Expression (1996 – 1999); The Public Service Broadcasting Council (1996 – 2004), Chair of The Government Commission on Development Policy (2002 – 2004), Member of the National Ibsen Committee (2000 – 2006), Member of the International Ibsen Committee (1993 – 2009) Chair of the Board of The Ibsen Centre at the University of Oslo (1996 – 2009). Member of the jury for the International Ibsen Awards (2012 – 2015).
